Freshman Class Offerings



◆ ***Agriculture & the Living Earth (credit/content equivalent to Biology & the Living Earth)** (pending)***

This course is for first year ag students preparing for careers in the agri-science industry or just interested in agriculture. This is a laboratory science class that is centered on biology, yet incorporates other science disciplines when appropriate. It is arranged around five areas. This course fulfills one year of science credit.

◆ ***Agricultural Mechanical Skills - 14507***

This course is designed for students interested in understanding basic agriculture mechanical skills. Units of instruction include shop safety, tool identification, use of power tool equipment, woodworking, metalworking, electricity, and concrete/masonry. This course fulfills one year of elective credit.

◆ ***Horticulture – 14570 *****

This course provides students an introduction to the principles and practices involved in the development, production, and use of horticultural crops, specifically landscape crops. Students will learn about plant identification, propagation methods, and business practices while helping manage the school's horticulture unit. This course fulfills one year of visual and performing art credit.
